



VISITING FELLOWS

We welcome inquiries from researchers and policy analysts who wish to conduct research and writing at our Centre in Canberra for a limited period of time.

Duration of the Visit

Length of stay can be negotiated but must be for at least a minimum of one month. Visiting Fellows are expected to work on a research product resulting in a NSPAC publication. For short visits (1 to 3 months), the project should comprise a literature review and/or discussion paper. For longer visits (more than 3 months), the project may also include focus groups or surveys.

Arrangements

Unfortunately, there is no financial assistance available for Visiting Fellows. The Centre is able to provide the use of a fully equipped office, assistance with focus group recruitment and dissemination of surveys (where appropriate), and an opportunity to participate in the Centre's activities and interact with our staff and other Canberra researchers.

How to Apply

If you are interested in an unfunded Visiting Fellowship, it is recommended that you first send a preliminary email or letter of inquiry to the address below, including a brief summary of your research project (with a realistic schedule and clearly defined outcome), the desired dates of the fellowship and a CV with contact details for two referees.

Visiting Fellows will be selected according to the following criteria:

- Demonstrated ability to make a contribution to knowledge in the field of productive ageing
- Value of the proposed Fellow's visit and contribution to the Centre

There is no deadline for applying but applications must be received at least six months in advance of the proposed starting date.
